




DECATUR SHELBY COUNTY YMCA Annual Report 2023





MESSAGE FROM BRETT

Dear YMCA Friends and Colleagues,

It has been an honor to serve as the board chief volunteer officer for the past year and I am thankful to have had the opportunity. This last year has seen a lot of exciting changes and I am glad to be a part of it. It is always a blessing to see the lives that we touch at our YMCA, by providing programs that both align with our mission and meet the needs of the community. Here are a few of the major accomplishments from 2023:

- In February, Shelby County held its Annual Daddy Daughter event with 32 participants attending and enjoying a fun-filled event with a catered meal, crafts and a special picture to commemorate the event.
- April 2023, both Decatur and Shelby County held their Annual Healthy Kids Day events.
 Decatur County hosted a Community Easter Egg Hunt in conjunction with theirs and had approximately 350 people attend. Shelby County's 2nd Annual Healthy Kids Day had approximately 500 people attend! In addition to its' Healthy Kids Event, Shelby County also held its Easter Egg Extravaganza which hosted 47 kiddos!
- In spring of 2023, the Decatur Shelby County YMCA was awarded the Lilly Grant Youth Development Award and the Youth Residential Grant Award that allowed the Association to initialize a Teen Program which grew throughout the year, starting with a Teen Leadership Advisory Board made up of local teens. It also allowed us to send 20 participants to Flat Rock Summer Camp for a week-long residential camp experience, and 5 families to weekend camp over Labor Day Weekend and one weekend in October. Also, we were able to send our fall break campers to Flat Rock for half a day to participate in a number of outdoor and indoor activities hosted by the Flat Rock River YMCA Camp.
- June 2023, Decatur County held its 24th Annual golf outing hosting 17 teams, and Shelby County held their second Annual Golf Outing in August, hosting 13 teams.
- In June, we also kicked off the "Y Introduction to STEM," funded in part by Honda, which included a 2-week Robotics
 camp, where 6 campers created a number of different robots including a "piano" and a "slingshot." It also included an
 introduction to Forensics that engaged our summer campers and our preschoolers preparing to do a "Farming the
 Future" activity this spring.
- The Shelby County YMCA hosted an 8-week "Summer of Growth" program sponsored by Edward Jones where they had over 230 participants take part in a different theme each week from Vacation Bible School, to arts and crafts, to sports and fitness. They also held a "Summer Starter Program" along with a "School Send Off" Program, which both totaled more than 30 kids!
- Decatur County's 21st Century Program, held at Greensburg Elementary School, had 61 participants. This program
 continues to assist children in making improvements in their math and reading skills to a C or better for over 96% of
 participants, exceeding the target goal of 70%.
- Decatur County hosted its Annual "Halloween Carnival" in October and had an attendance over 300 people. Shelby County held its an Annual "Candy Swim" Event which had 18 children attend.
- In December, Decatur County had a booth at the Decatur County Memorial Hospital's Holiday Lane Event where there were over 700 participants. Shelby County held its Annual Doughnuts with Santa, which always has a fantastic following, and 2023 was no different! There were 102 participants that enjoyed this special event!
- Our Association continues to support those individuals and families in need, allocating \$119,865 in financial aid to 434
 participants allowing them to utilize our facility and programs such as, child care, youth programs and memberships.
- Our Preschool Program remains a Paths to Quality, Level 3, one of only a few in the area. Paths to Quality is Indiana's
 voluntary quality rating and improvement system that includes four levels. We served over 118 students in our
 preschool program in 2023.
- As an Association at the end of 2023, we had a combined 5,137 membership units between the two branches: 2,206 from Decatur County and 2,931 from Shelby County.

2023 was a very successful year for both branches. I see the many great opportunities for growth for us as an association and look forward to all the new things we can achieve. Thank you for your continued support of the YMCA.

MEMBER TRIBUTE: Decatur County Family YMCA



On December 31, 2023, we lost a very dear and valued member of our YMCA family, Cricket Snodgrass. Cricket was 90 years old and had been coming to the YMCA since we opened at our current location in 2000. She started doing water aerobics to help with rehab from a double knee replacement. Cricket attributed her fountain of youth to the YMCA. She was here every Monday, Wednesday and Friday: walking on the track, lifting weights and using the machines in the Wellness Center and teaching a Water Aerobics class from 4:00 pm— 5:00 pm on those days. When you asked her about lifting weights and working out, Cricket would laugh and say "according to a friend of mine, who I recently got started lifting weights, I have some guns" She always encouraged people to exercise and promoted the YMCA wherever she went, whether sitting in the sauna after

her water aerobics class or delivering meals for Meals on Wheels, an organization she has been a part of for 15 years, or working Spirit of Women events. When asked if she considered herself a role model, Cricket would say, "I didn't intend to be one, but I guess I am because all of friends want to do what I do and follow me. I have quite the following and I am very social!" As mentioned earlier, Cricket was one our best and most humble volunteers here at the YMCA. She also took home the "Volunteer of the Year Award" in 2010. She made snacks for events or just because! We will definitely miss her homemade "thin mint" cookies! Cricket also supplied the Preschool area with art supplies, stickers and ice packs, or anything else the kids needed throughout the year. We were lucky to have spent some time with her early in December to catch up and have lunch. She was one of the greatest assets our community had and we were so lucky to have her as part of our YMCA family! She will be greatly missed!

Coming to the Y has improved the quality of my life. One of the biggest improvements has been with prevention of injuries. I attend the Silver Sneakers classes. We work on joint mobility, stability and balance. Recently, I was on a trip to Florida. I walked out onto the pool deck and missed a step and came down on the side of my ankle. I instantly thought I probably just ruined my trip by breaking my ankle! Much to my surprise, it had no impact on my ankle at all. I give the credit to exercises I do in my Silver Sneakers class. Also, I've noticed when I am driving, I have more flexibility in being able to turn my head looking for traffic. An added benefit has been the Christian spiritual emphasis in place. It's nice to have the Chapel to visit, the Prayer Board to use and the Spiritual Vitamins to read. I enjoy meeting the wonderful people at the Y. The staff is helpful and you can feel the kindness of the guests when you enter the building. Going to the Y is one of my favorite times of day!

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

21st CENTURY

Decatur County's 21st Century Program allows qualified children additional care after school which includes recreation time, tutoring and enrichment, while being under the supervision of trained Y staff. Students are also fed a full, well-balanced meal through our year-round feeding program. In 2023, our program served 61 students. 96% of the 1st through 5th grade regular participants achieved a C or better in reading and math from the Fall to Spring semester. Both measurements exceeded the target goal of 70%.

PRESCHOOL/AFTERSCHOOL/CAMP

Our entire child care department is devoted to assisting our community's children in the areas of growth, learning and development, centered in a loving, Christian atmosphere while teaching them educational components and structuring the process based on our core values of honesty, caring, respect and responsibility.

- Our Preschool is a licensed program and has achieved Paths to Quality Level 3 status, out of 4, which we achieved in 2022.
- In 2023, Decatur County's afterschool and camp attendance almost doubled from 2022!
- The Annual Campaign in 2023 allowed 69 children to receive child care.

YOUTH PROGRAMMING

We are able to offer a variety of classes and leagues geared specifically for our youth in a quest to come alongside parents and help teach basic skills while encouraging positive behavior.

• 37 additional children participated in youth sports with financial assistance from our Annual Campaign drive.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

INDIANA YOUTH AND GOVERNMENT (INYaG)



It is one thing to learn about governmental processes in government class, and it is another to experience the processes first-hand. Declan Bruns, Brenley Jameson, Carmin Ripperger, Charlie Stauffacher, and Tyler Williams

represented the Decatur County Family YMCA at the Indiana YMCA's Youth and Government conference held in Indianapolis on March 8-10, 2024. Established in 1965, the program is a model government conference in which students can participate in a mock version of the Indiana State Senate, Indiana House of Representatives, or Indiana Supreme Court. The program enhances students' debate, critical thinking, and public speaking skills, as well as governmental processes and legislation knowledge. Bruns and Ripperger served as youth Representatives, Stauffacher and Williams served as youth Senators, and Jameson served as a youth justice/attorney. Both

Stauffacher's and Williams's bills passed in the Senate. Stauffacher's bill concerned access to rural mental health resources. Williams's bill advocated for a reflective tape for law enforcement vehicles, and Bruns and Ripperger's collaborative bill sought to end shaming around school lunches. "Our group of students has been working on their bills and cases since October of last year. Each student worked diligently to prepare for the conference, as evident by their performance in the conference," said Sam Miller, program advisor. In addition to the debate sectors of the conference, students can run for appointed offices. Additionally, Stauffacher will serve as the Youth Lt. Governor for the 2025 conference making him the third Lt. Governor from the Decatur County Family YMCA in just five years! Diane Hart-Dawson, CEO of the Decatur County Family YMCA noted "It is great to see local high school students participate in this area of civil engagement. I have had the privilege of watching our participants for the last several years. I am always impressed by the professional way in which they present themselves and the leadership skills they display. It is also a testament to the hard work of our students that they have been appointed to the Lt Governor position so often."

SAFETY AROUND WATER/SWIM LESSONS

Safety Around Water has been introduced in more than 2,200 pools across the United States in an effort to teach basic swimming skills, personal safety and safe water principles to children. While drowning is a concern for all children – it's the second leading cause of unintentional injury-related death for children ages one to 14 years old. Thanks to generous sponsorship from KB Specialty Foods. We were able to enroll 63 participants in this program in 2023! A grant from YMCA of the USA allowed us to offer FREE Swim Lessons to children in our communities and we were able to enroll 44 participants in 2023!



HEALTHY KIDS DAY

Every year we host a Healthy Kids Day at the YMCA. Healthy Kids Day is a nationally celebrated YMCA event, that concentrates on the belief that children who possess knowledge of healthy habits will grow into strong adults. The YMCA offers a variety of programs to help children and families achieve this goal. Together, we can provide the community with the ability to develop healthy lifestyles. In 2023, Decatur County had approximately 350 people join us along with 22 vendor booths and Touch A Truck participants. Shelby County's 2nd year of hosting brought Boomer, the Pacers Mascot, to the event again along with approximately 25 vendors and 500 people!









HEALTHY LIVING

EVIDENCE-BASED HEALTH INTERVENTIONS

The YMCA is focused on doing whatever it takes to help reduce the onset of chronic diseases in our community. We strive to increase the overall health and well-being of everyone who walks through our doors. We currently offer many Evidence-Based Health Intervention Programs at our facility like the Blood Pressure Self–Monitoring Program and Diabetes Prevention Program and Delay the Disease: Parkinson's Exercise Program. This program is designed for people living with Parkinson's Disease to help empower those living with the disease by optimizing their physical function and helping to delay the progression of their symptoms.

Delay the Disease: Parkinson's Exercise Program

What happens in class?

- Flexibility utilizing yoga and dynamic stretching
- Coordination utilizing stability balls, medicine balls, agility drills, dance, ladder walking and boxing
- Respiratory yells, cheers and various voice drills
- Cardiovascular walking, marching, cycling, boxing, rowing
- Balance standing on one foot, side stepping, tandem standing and walking
- Strength training using weighted medicine balls, dumbbells, resistance tubes and bodyweight

Changes participants have noticed:

- Improved posture & strength
- Improved balance & walking ability
- Help preventing falls & restore general functional ability
- Improved cardiovascular health
- May also see improvement in memory, sleep, mental health and overall quality of life

Statistics from class:

- Eleven people have been enrolled in this program, but only three people have completed at least a full 12-weeks of the class program to date.
- The three participants that have completed at least 12-weeks of the program decreased their Sit to Stand Score by 50%, decreasing the time it took to complete Five Sit to Stands by 1/2 at the end of the 12-week program.
- Both participants were able to balance on one leg for 30 seconds, which was 10 seconds longer than when they started the program.
- Both participants also decreased their Timed Up and Go score by 3 seconds from when they started the class.

Blood Pressure Self-Monitoring Program

The simple process of checking and recording your blood pressure at least twice a month over a period of four months has been shown to lower blood pressure in many people with high blood pressure. The YMCA's Blood Pressure Self-Monitoring Program helps participants:

Reduce their blood pressure by identifying patterns and trends on which to take action

- Better manage their blood pressure over time
- Increase their awareness of triggers that elevate blood pressure
- Improve their knowledge of heart-healthy eating habits
- Enrich communication with their health care provider by sharing self-monitoring results

Nutritional Seminars are also offered one time a month and highlight how food is related to blood pressure management and will provide knowledge and skills to make heart-healthy choices. Seminar topics include reducing sodium intake and heart healthy eating.

During 2023, the Decatur County Family YMCA had 9 participants complete the 4-month Blood Pressure Self-Monitoring program, but we continue to follow up and see people both inside and out of the Y, to have their blood pressure checked and do nutrition seminars.

ANNUAL YMCA GOLF CLASSIC

Our 24th Annual YMCA Golf Classic was held on Thursday, June 8, 2023 at the Greensburg Country Club to help raise money for our Annual Campaign. This year, we had 17 teams that participated and over 40 hole sponsors! NEW this year was our Silent Auction went completely online which allowed us to provide a variety of new items along with all our donated items. It also helped keep our Auction very streamlined this year. Altogether over \$8300 was raised to help families participate in Y programming that may not otherwise be able to participate. Thank you again to all our participants and sponsors for helping us have such a wonderful event this year!



TREE CITY ROLLING TOUR

June 24, 2023 marked our 14th Annual Tree City Rolling Tour & Century Ride, which starts and ends at our beautiful Courthouse. This year's race hosted over 230 riders who endured 90 degree plus heat on the day of the race! Depending on the distance chosen, riders were able to ride around beautiful Lake Santee or ride through scenic Enochsburg and Hamburg areas or even out to explore Westport, like the 52, 100 mile bike riders did, leaving before 7:00 am race morning! Refreshments were placed every eight to 15 miles along each route for riders to get off of their bikes, stretch, use rest rooms if needed and grab a quick snack. After finishing up their rides, riders were welcomed back to the Courthouse Square for a wonderful meal. This year, Bob Jackman, had the honor of being our oldest rider at 80 years young! He completed the 16 mile distance along with some of his grandsons and their friends. All the riders complimented the food, music and won-



derful sag (refreshment) stops, and friendly volunteers. We look forward to seeing all of the riders and lots of new-comers next year. Deena Hamer, Ride Coordinator, said, "I would like to thank all of our sponsors and volunteers again this year. It was exciting to end year two with 2931 membership units, an increase in 449 units from the previous year. We look forward to welcoming even more members in 2024!















REVENUE BY BRANCH

Decatur County Family YMCA Membership & Program Revenue 5 year Comparison




Shelby County YMCA Membership & Program Revenue 3 year Comparison




