Reflecting on the transformations we've witnessed, I am deeply grateful for the opportunity to contribute to such dynamic progress at our YMCA. It's a privilege to witness firsthand the profound impact we have on the lives we touch through programs that not only align with our mission but also keenly meet the needs of our community. Some of our key accomplishments in 2024 include:

- We bid farewell to Diane Hart-Dawson after her 25-year tenure as our leader, paving the way for a new chapter. Following a rigorous national search, we are thrilled to welcome Mackenzie Pickerrell as the incoming CEO of the Decatur Shelby County YMCA starting January. Mackenzie brings a wealth of experience in youth and community development, most notably as the inaugural Executive Director for the Girl Coalition of Indiana. Her expertise extends through significant roles at Girls Inc. of Greater Indianapolis, where her strategic planning and community engagement shone. With a Master's in Public Affairs and a deep commitment to our core values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility, Mackenzie is the ideal leader to guide our YMCA into a future of inclusive and transformative community development.
- Our membership remains robust, totaling 10,811 across the association, with 4,150 in Decatur County and 6,661 in Shelby County. This strong foundation allows us to reach more lives every day.
- In our afterschool programs, including the standout 21st Century Program at Greensburg Elementary, we served 104 kids this past year. We're not just filling time; we're filling lives with STEAM programming, physical fitness, and crucial academic and emotional growth. Impressively, over 92% of participants have improved their math and reading skills to a grade of C or better.
- Our commitment to fostering healthy lifestyles was highlighted during the Healthy Kids Day, attracting nearly 1,000 youth and families.
- We allocated \$137,419 in financial aid this year, ensuring that no one is turned away due to financial constraints.
- Our preschool, rated a Level III Path to Quality, continues to excel, preparing 80 children for kindergarten annually through both full-day and half-day programs.
- Lastly, the ongoing roof replacement project is a testament to our community's support and the dedication of our committee, including Doug Smith, Herb Hunter, Ed Fox, Carl Harcourt, Brett Abplanalp, Mary Stradley, Alan Lowe, Robert Pumphrey, and Dennis Hagerty. We expect completion by early May, securing our facility's integrity for decades to come.

As we celebrate these successes, the horizon is bright with potential. The foundation we've built is strong, and the pathways for growth and further achievement are expansive. I am eager to see what we can accomplish together in the coming year. Thank you all for your unwavering support of the YMCA. Your dedication fuels our mission and enriches our community.

# YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

## **21st CENTURY**

Decatur County's 21st Century Program allows qualified children additional care after school which includes recreation time, tutoring and enrichment, while being under the supervision of trained Y staff. In 2024, our program served 61 students. 87% of the 1st through 5th grade regular participants achieved a C or better in reading and math from the Fall to Spring semester. Both measurements exceeded the target goal of 70%.

## **PRESCHOOL/AFTERSCHOOL/CAMP**

Our entire child care department is devoted to assisting our community's children in the areas of growth, learning and development, centered in a loving, Christian atmosphere while teaching them educational components and structuring the process based on our core values of honesty, caring, respect and responsibility.

- Our Preschool is a licensed program and has maintained its Paths to Quality Level 3 status, out of 4 and served 81 kids in 2024.
- Day Campers in 2024 equalled 115 youth participants for all the camps in Decatur County and 11 youths in Shelby County for fall Break Camp.
- Our 2024 Annual Campaign allowed 73 children to receive child care.

## **SUMMER OF GROWTH/ SCHOOL SEND OFF**

Shelby County offers Summer of Growth and School Send Off to kids over the summer and the time leading up to school. The programs had over 251 youth participants. Over the course of the 8 weeks, children were able to participate in many different activities.

- 5 children received financial assistance to attend Summer of Growth due to our Annual Campaign

## **YOUTH PROGRAMMING**

We are able to offer a variety of classes and leagues geared specifically for our youth in a quest to come alongside parents and help teach basic skills while encouraging positive behavior.

- 26 additional children participated in youth sports and/or leagues with financial assistance from our Annual Campaign.
- Both the Decatur and Shelby County YMCA's hosted a Daddy Daughter Event with 99 people attending and enjoying some much deserved Daddy Daughter bonding time!
- The Shelby County YMCA also hosts an Easter Pool Party around Easter time that 38 people attended in 2024.
- The Donuts with Santa event that Shelby County YMCA hosts every year is always a well-attended event that brought close to 100 participants in 2024 and has grown each year since its inception.

## **INDIANA YOUTH AND GOVERNMENT (INYaG)**

It is one thing to learn about governmental processes in government class, and it is another to experience the processes first-hand. Declan Bruns, Brenley Jameson, Carmin Ripperger, Charlie Stauffacher, and Tyler Williams represented the Decatur Shelby County YMCA at the Indiana YMCA's Youth and Government conference held in Indianapolis on February 28-March 2, 2025. Established in 1965, the program is a model government conference in which students can participate in a mock version of the Indiana State Senate, Indiana House of Representatives, or Indiana Supreme Court. The program enhances students' debate, critical thinking, and public speaking skills, as well as governmental processes and legislation knowledge. Additionally, Stauffacher served as the Youth Lt. Governor for the 2025 conference making him the third Lt. Governor from the Decatur County Family YMCA in just five years!

## **SAFETY AROUND WATER/ SWIM LESSONS**

Safety Around Water has been introduced in more than 2,200 pools across the United States in an effort to teach basic swimming skills, personal safety and safe water principles to children. While drowning is a concern for all children – it's the second leading cause of unintentional injury-related death for children ages one to 14 years old. Thanks to generous sponsorship from KB Specialty Foods and a grant from YMCA of the USA we were able to offer FREE Swim Lessons to 132 children in our communities in 2024!

## **HEALTHY KIDS DAY**

Every year we host a Healthy Kids Day, a nationally celebrated YMCA event, that concentrates on the belief that children who possess knowledge of healthy habits will grow into strong adults. The YMCA offers a variety of programs to help children and families achieve this goal. Together, we can provide the community with the ability to develop healthy lifestyles. In 2024, Decatur County had approximately 230 people join us along with 32 vendor booths and Touch A Truck participants. Shelby County's 3rd year of hosting brought Freddie, the Indiana Fever's Mascot, to the event for the first time with approximately 25 vendors and 500 people!





# HEALTHY LIVING

## **EVIDENCE-BASED HEALTH INTERVENTIONS**

The YMCA is focused on doing whatever it takes to help reduce the onset of chronic diseases in our community. We strive to increase the overall health and well-being of everyone who walks through our doors. We currently offer many Evidence-Based Health Intervention Programs at our facilities like Brain and Body Works: Parkinson's Exercise Class, Blood Pressure Self-Monitoring Program, Diabetes Prevention Program and recently we added LiveStrong at the YMCA, a cancer support program.

### **Brain and Body Works: Parkinson's Exercise Program (Decatur County Family YMCA)**

This is an evidenced-based fitness program for people living with Parkinson's Disease. The program is designed to empower those living with Parkinson's disease by optimizing their physical function and helping to delay the progression of their symptoms. Research shows that exercise benefits people with PD. Participating in regular exercise can help your body cope with the disease and results in stabilization or improvement of symptoms.

Changes participants have noticed:

- Improved posture & strength
- Improved balance & walking ability
- Help preventing falls & restore general functional ability
- Improved cardiovascular health
- May also see improvement in memory, sleep, mental health and overall quality of life

### **Blood Pressure Self-Monitoring Program**

Our Blood Pressure Self-Monitoring Program helps adults with hypertension lower and better manage their blood pressure. The simple process of checking and recording one's blood pressure at least twice a month has been shown to lower blood pressure in some people with hypertension. This program focuses on regular monitoring of one's blood pressure at home using proper measuring techniques, individualized support and nutrition education in an effort to reduce blood pressure and improve their quality of life. Reducing your sodium intake is an effective tool in preventing heart disease, whether you have high blood pressure, are at risk for heart disease or just want to keep your heart healthy.

Decatur County Family YMCA goes into the community to offer this program and saw over 15 participants multiple times during 2024.

### **Diabetes Prevention Program (Decatur County Family YMCA)**

Did you know? About 79 million American adults have prediabetes, a condition where blood glucose levels are higher than normal. People with prediabetes are likely to develop type 2 diabetes within 10 years, unless they take action to prevent or delay the disease. Diabetes is a leading cause of heart disease, stroke, blindness, kidney disease and nerve disease.

The Good News, the YMCA's Diabetes Prevention Program, you can work with others in a small group setting to learn how to adopt habits that will improve your overall health and well-being and reduce your risk. Programs like the Diabetes Prevention Program have been shown to prevent or delay type 2 diabetes in individuals over age 60 by 70%.

### **LIVESTRONG at the YMCA**

Cancer is a life-changing disease that takes a tremendous physical and emotional toll on those affected. The Y and the LIVESTRONG Foundation have joined together to create LIVESTRONG at the YMCA, an evidence-based physical activity and well-being program designed to help adult cancer survivors reclaim their total health. Participants work with Y staff trained in supportive cancer care to safely achieve their goals such as building muscle mass and strength, increasing flexibility and endurance, and improving confidence and self-esteem.

Shelby County YMCA had 6 participants go through this program in 2024.

Decatur County Family YMCA added this program in 2025.

# SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

## ANNUAL YMCA GOLF CLASSIC

Our 25th Annual YMCA Golf Classic was held on Thursday, June 6, 2024 at the Greensburg Country Club. We raised money for our Annual Campaign. This year, we had 12 teams that participated and over 30 hole sponsors! Our Silent Auction provided a variety of new items along with all our donated items. Altogether over \$4200 was raised to help families participate in Y programming that they may not otherwise be able to participate in. Thank you again to all our participants and sponsors for helping us have such a wonderful event this year!

## TREE CITY ROLLING TOUR

June 29, 2024 marked our 15th Annual Tree City Rolling Tour & Century Ride, which starts and ends at our beautiful Courthouse. 2024's race hosted over 260 riders! Depending on the distance chosen, riders were able to ride around beautiful Lake Santee or ride through the scenic Enochsburg and Hamburg areas or even out to explore Westport. Rest stops with refreshments were placed every 8 to 15 miles along each route for riders to get off their bikes, stretch, and grab a quick snack. After finishing, riders were welcomed back to the Courthouse Square for a wonderful meal. All the riders complimented the food, music, wonderful sag (refreshment) stops, and friendly volunteers. This non-competitive bike ride raises funds for our Annual Campaign, which gives out financial assistance to members of our community.

## CORPORATE CHALLENGE

The 2024 Corporate Challenge brought together the Decatur County Memorial Hospital, First Financial Bank, Honda, Valeo and the YMCA fighting over who would win the coveted Corporate Challenge Crown over the course of four days in September. The events ranged from Euchre and Bowling to Trivia and Whiffle Ball Challenge and Volleyball with the Honda team taking 1st Place and First Financial Bank taking 2nd place and winning Most Volunteers and Team Spirit!

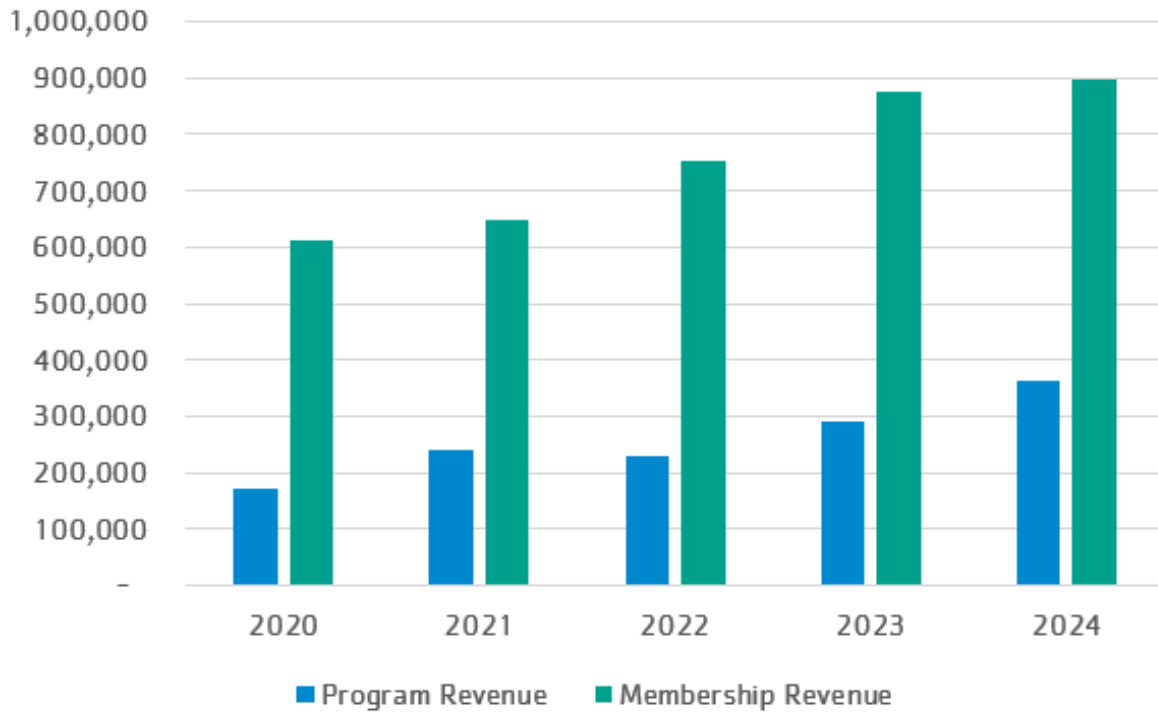

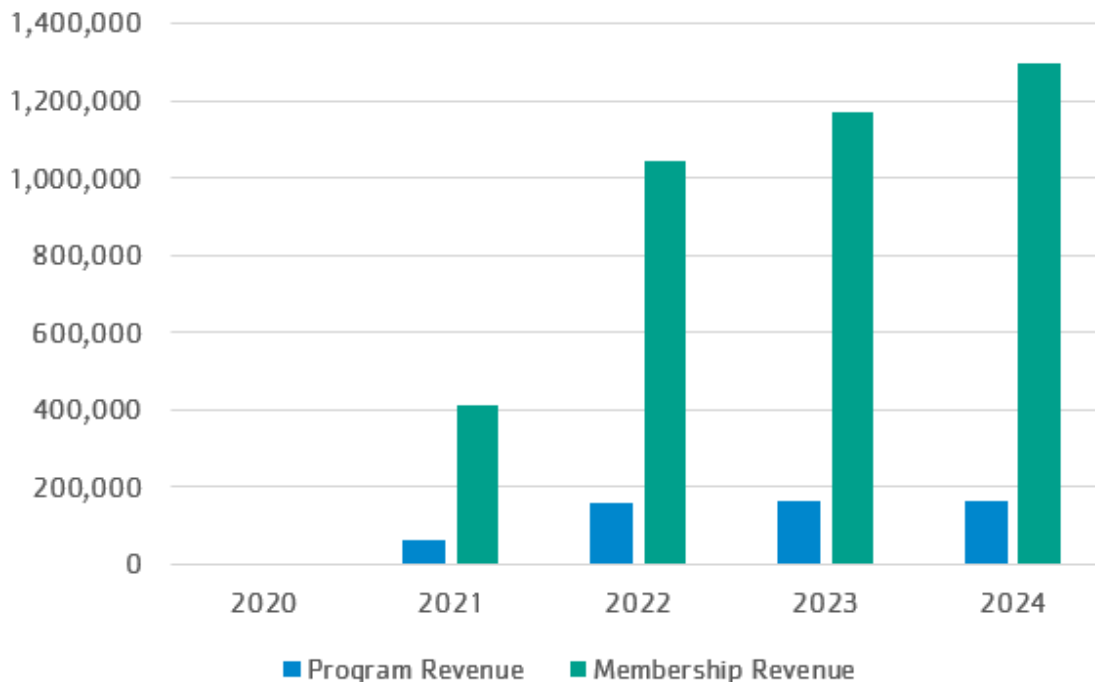


# REVENUE BY BRANCH

## Decatur County Family YMCA

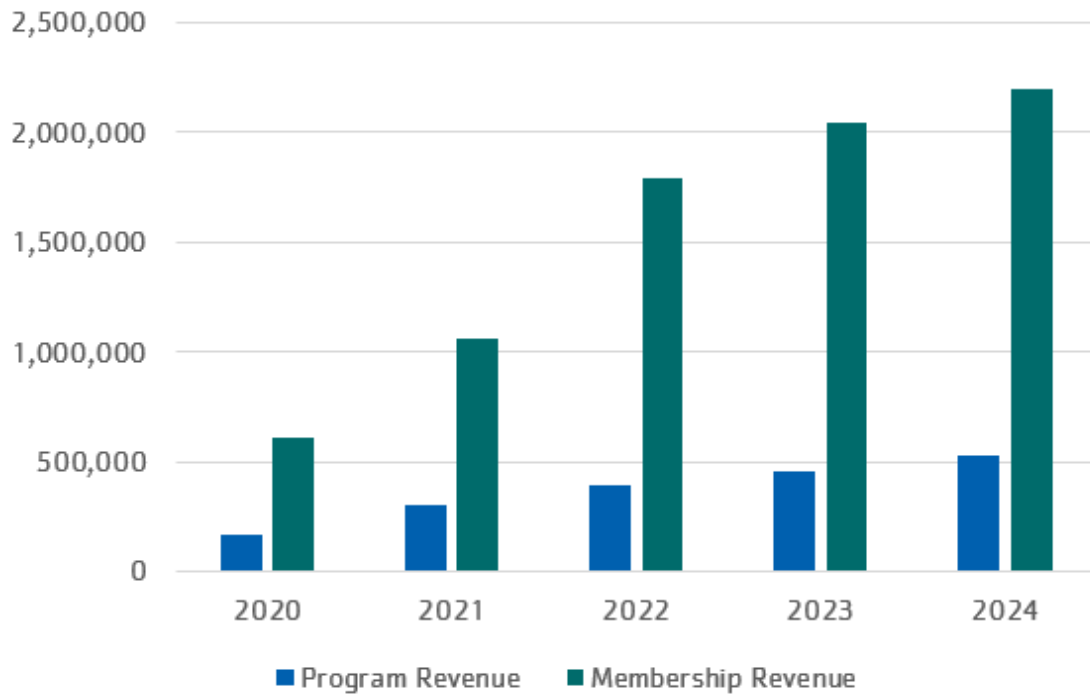

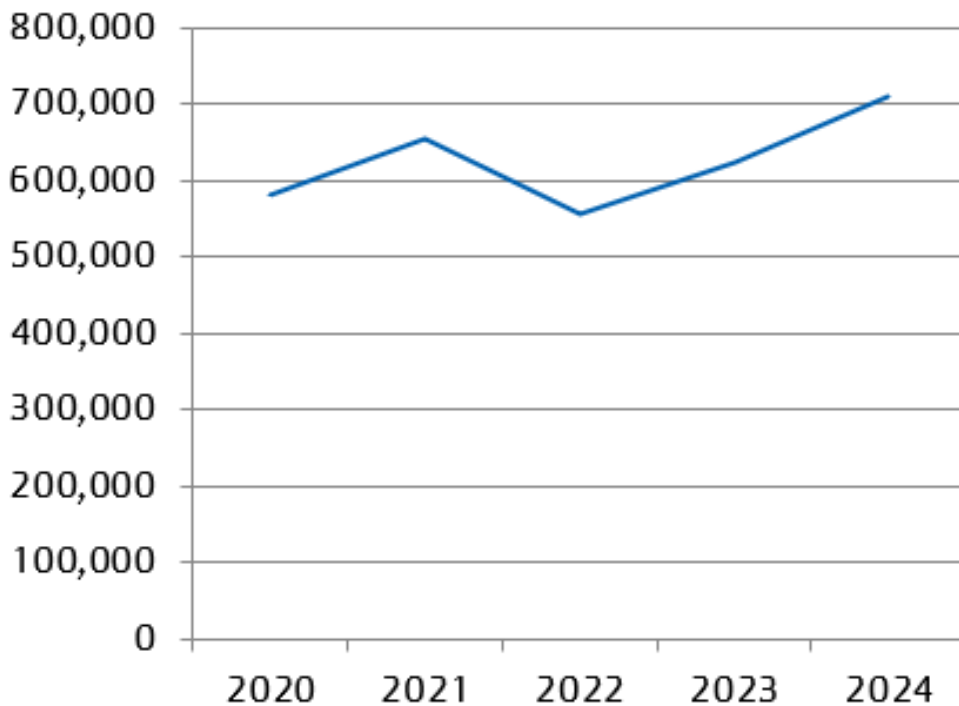

## Endowment

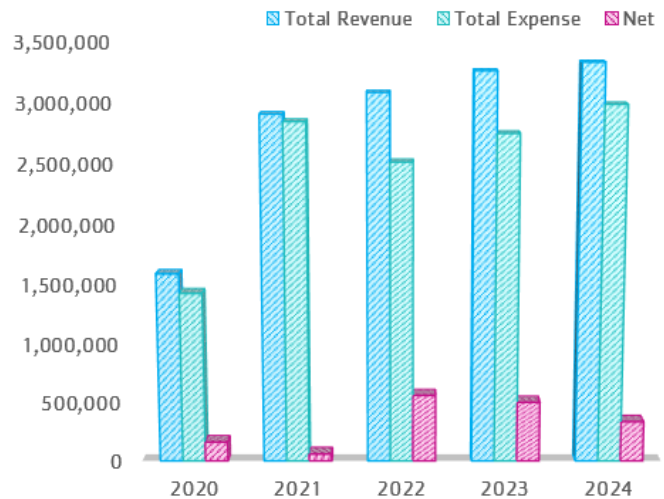
